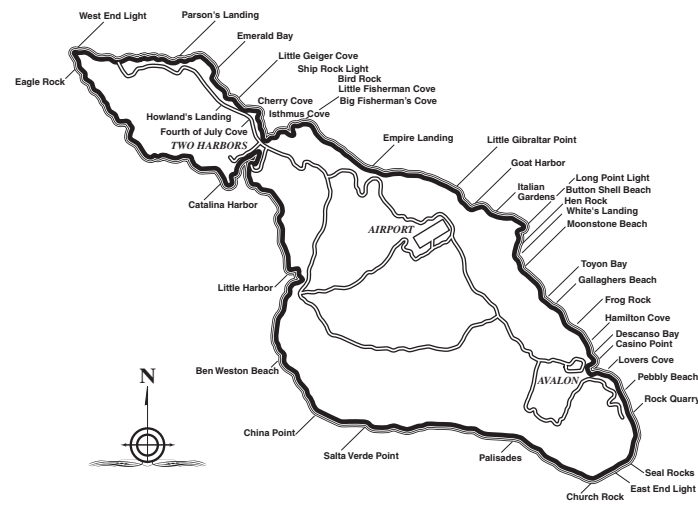
October 15th – *Palm Sunday:

IMPORTANT RULES TO REMEMBER

1. All mooring assignments are made at the harbor entrance.
2. 5 MPH speed limit or wakeless in all moorage and anchorage areas.
3. 14' maximum limit at all dinghy docks.
4. Anchorage responsibility outside of Avalon Bay is left to the discretion of each and every boat operator.
5. Avalon Harbor Dept. monitors VHF 16 & 12.
6. Avalon Shoreboat service monitors VHF 9.

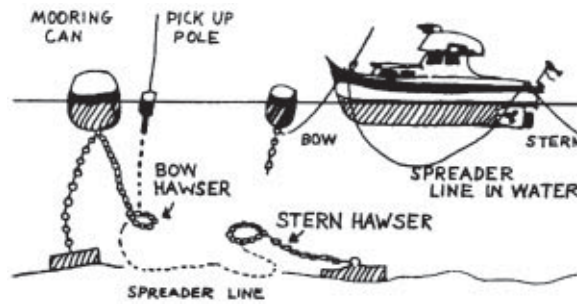

HARBOR PROCEDURES & REGULATIONS

- All moorings are on a first-come, first-serve basis. Upon arrival, please stand by the harbor entrance for mooring assignment from a patrol boat. No mooring work is done over VHF.
- On the day of departure, moorings must be vacated by 9:00 am.**
- Avalon is a NO DISCHARGE area.** No sewage may be discharged whether treated or untreated. This law is strictly enforced.
- Service boats will make daily trash pick-ups free of charge twice daily during the summer months and on weekends in winter months. Plastic trash bags may be obtained from the service boat or Harbor Master's office.
- To ensure a peaceful coexistence, all generators must be secured at 10:00 pm nightly and not be started before 7:00 am.
- The mooring you are assigned is not guaranteed. You may have to relocate daily. If you are required to relocate, a patrol boat will contact you between 7:30 am – 9:00 am the day you are required to move.
- It is illegal to leave Avalon and leave your vessel unattended.
- Anchorage is located west of the red jetty light. You must anchor at least 300' away from any dive park or mooring can. Plan on a depth of 80'–100'. This area is not patrolled and you anchor at your own risk.
- Water on the island is precious and conservation will be appreciated.
- All floats, with exception of the Shore-boat Float, may be used for loading and unloading. Time on float is limited to 10 minutes only. No vessel may be left on a float unattended.
- There is a fine for an opened container of alcohol on the streets of Avalon. (This includes the Pier and floats.)



MOORING USAGE

- Pick up pole, attach Bow Hawser to Bow Cleat. (Hawser is located approximately 6' below the surface of the water.)
- Run Spreader Line to stern of boat. (Spreader Line is attached to Bow Hawser.)
- Take all slack out of Spreader Line and attach Stern Hawser to Stern Cleat.
- Re-check Bow and Stern Cleats to make sure you are moored securely. Drop slack Spreader Line into water.

The tide will effect your mooring. Lines will need to be adjusted periodically to take up slack or to be let out.

Upon leaving the mooring, untie stern, then bow lines and drop into water.

Allow enough time for the lines and spreader to sink free and clear of the propeller of your vessel to prevent fouling.

Mooring Fees:

Boats 30' and under.....	\$37.00 per night
Boats 31' to 39'.....	\$41.00 per night
Boats 40' to 49'.....	\$50.00 per night
Boats 50' to 59'.....	\$61.00 per night
Boats 60' to 69'.....	\$80.00 per night
Boats 70' to 79'.....	\$98.00 per night
Boats 80' to 89'.....	\$111.00 per night
Boats 90' to 99'.....	\$132.00 per night
Boats 100' and over.....	\$149.00 per night

Mooring fees are payable on arrival by cash, check or credit card to the patrol boat. All mooring fees must be paid before departure. Unpaid fees will be doubled.

VISITORS' SERVICES

DINGHY DOCKS — Dinghy docks are provided throughout the harbor for dinghies 14' and under. We recommend dinghy locks.

SHOREBOATS — Shoreboat service monitors VHF channel 9. Charge per person, per way.

MARINE MECHANIC — Several are available and may be contacted by calling "Marine Repair" on VHF channel 16.

VESSEL ASSIST — Call Vessel Assist on VHF channel 16 or (310) 510-1675 or (800) 367-8222.

MARINE FUEL DOCK — Gas and diesel are available at the fuel dock (310) 510-0046. Limited hours. Winter available 8 – 4 by pager.

OIL COLLECTION — Used oil collection available at Fuel Dock.

CHAMBER OF COMMERCE — End of the Pleasure Pier. (310) 510-1520.

ICE — Available on Shoreboat Float, fuel dock and grocery and liquor stores.

GROCERY STORES — Located on Catalina Ave. and Metropole Ave.

PUMP-A-HEAD — Free of charge Pump Out Float located on west side of harbor near the Casino. Mobile service available on channel 68 or call (310) 292-1226.

WATER — Located at fuel dock and Pump-A-Head float at west side of Harbor near the Casino.

SHOWERS — Token operated. Located on Casino Way. Towel rental available.

RESTROOMS — Located at Casino. Mole Terminal, Casino Way, and Pleasure Pier.

LAUNDROMAT — At Casino showers and two other locations on Metropole.

PROPANE — Edison plant at Pebble Beach. Hours: M-F 9-12/1-4
