

## RECYCLING LEGISLATION

### Assembly Bill 939 [AB 939]

required jurisdictions to meet diversion goals of 25% by 1995 and 50% by the year 2000 resulting in the implementation of:

- Drop-off recycling programs
- Curbside recycling
- Commercial recycling
- Construction and demolition recycling

### Assembly Bill 341 [AB 341]

Sets a statewide goal that not less than 75% of solid waste be diverted from landfill disposal. It requires that all businesses that generate 4 or more cubic yards of solid waste per week or is a multifamily dwelling of 5 units or more to either:

- Participate in a recycling program with their local waste hauler.
- Donate, sell and/or self-haul materials to a recycling facility.

### Assembly Bill 1826 [AB 1826]

requires businesses to separate their food scraps and green waste for recycling. AB 1826 builds on the success of the mandatory commercial recycling program established by AB 341.

To comply with AB 1826, a business or multifamily dwelling may:

- Participate in a recycling program with their local waste hauler
- Donate, sell and/or self haul materials to an organic recycling facility
- Compost organic materials

Multifamily dwellings are exempt from the food waste recycling requirement, but must properly recycle their green waste.

# IT'S THE LAW! BUSINESS RECYCLING

THESE ITEMS ARE RECYCLABLE AND SHOULD BE PLACED IN YOUR RECYCLING BIN OR RECYCLE CART.

## PAPER

- Cardboard
- Unsolicited Mail
- Magazines
- Newspaper
- Milk or Juice Cartons
- Phone Books

## METAL

- Aluminum Cans
- Tin Cans

## GLASS

- Bottles
- Jars

## PLASTICS

- Drink Bottles
- Detergent Containers
- Milk Containers



## Separate Your Food Waste From Your Regular Waste and Recyclables

Food waste must be separated from your regular waste. Establish a "food scraps only" container at convenient locations throughout your business. Line each of these containers with a green bag\*. Place your food scraps in the green bag. After filling the bag up, place it into the waste bin. Once delivered to the MRF for processing the food bag will be easily identifiable and segregated from the other waste. Instead of going to the landfill, food scraps collected in the green bags will be composted.

### Compostable Food Waste Includes:

Fruits  
Vegetables  
Meat  
Poultry  
Seafood  
Shellfish  
Rice  
Beans  
Pasta  
Bread  
Cheese  
Eggshells  
Coffee Grounds

### Non-Acceptable Material Includes:

Plastics  
Styrofoam  
Glass  
Metal  
Liquids

1 Place Food Waste Into Green Bag

2 Place Filled Green Bags Into Bin



All waste deposited into the blue container is transported to the Pebbly Beach Landfill Material Recovery Facility [MRF] where recyclables are removed through a process of manual sorting. Using your green bags for organic material will assist us with maximum recovery of recyclables.

\*Green bags at no charge may be ordered by contacting Avalon Environmental Services to arrange delivery.
